What has happened?

2nd Policy Roundtable

The objective of this meeting was to foster productive discussions regarding the creation of a robust public health framework with the following key objectives:

- a)to scrutinize discrimination and ensure equitable access to healthcare services,
- b) to address and mitigate discriminatory and stereotypical attitudes, and c) to enhance the knowledge, training, and competencies of healthcare professionals by imparting specialized expertise.

The meeting revolved around three central pillars, specifically:

- Education.
- 2) Accessibility and equitable treatment within the healthcare system, and
- The legal and institutional framework in conjunction with ongoing developments in this context.

National info day

The primary objective of the National Info Day was to disseminate research findings pertaining to the effective management of gender identity discrimination within healthcare systems. Additionally, it sought to provide valuable insights into the present state of healthcare and psychosocial support services, with a particular focus on transgender individuals. Essentially, the event served as a platform for educating and raising awareness among attendees about these critical issues within healthcare and support services.

Online training platform (MOOC)

The Online Training Platform (MOOC) was developed by READLAB, which utilized suitable software tools to convert the training content into interactive online resources. These digital training materials were subsequently amalgamated and structured to craft compelling and interactive learning modules. READLAB oversaw the technical components of this procedure, encompassing the transformation of materials into digital learning objects and the resolution of issues related to compatibility, interoperability, and streaming.

Athens Pride

On June 10, 2023, the Transcare consortium participated actively and with great enthusiasm in the Athens Pride Festival 2023, themed "Once upon a time." The consortium's presence at the festival aimed to underscore their strong support for a diverse range of critical issues, such as the promotion of rights, the advancement of inclusivity, and the advocacy for societal equality.

At the festival, the "Transcare" booth served as an informative hub where the general public could access comprehensive information about the Transcare program. Attendees had the opportunity to gain insights into the program's overarching objectives, significant milestones achieved, and the key findings obtained as the project steadily advances toward its ultimate completion.

Final Conference

After three years of rigorous research and collaboration, the Transcare Project successfully concluded with the Final Conference, hosted by the National and Kapodistrian University of Athens and the MSc. Global Health - Disaster Medicine program, occurred on June 30, 2023, at 16:00 in the "PLYFA" area.

The purpose of the Final Conference was to showcase the research findings related to optimal treatment practices for addressing gender identity discrimination within healthcare systems. Additionally, the event aimed to provide insights into the present state of healthcare and psychosocial support services, particularly in relation to service provision for transgender individuals.
